Dear Fellow Parishioners:

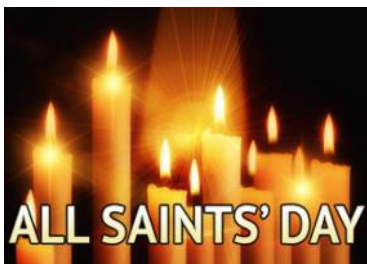
I grew up the daughter of a church organist and choir master in Massachusetts so you might say I've been preparing for this job since I was 9 years old. I am so excited to be joining the staff of Parish of the Holy Eucharist as Director of Music Ministry and continuing to build on the choral music program established by Pat and Ron Siviski over 30 years ago. We have such an opportunity to capture the spirits of our young people and families as there has been a resurgence of beautiful choral music in the church as of late. When I was growing up in the 70's, I was not exposed to the composer likes of Mozart, Handel, Durufle, Palestrina or Byrd in my little Catholic church but rather in my prep school concert choir.

I always wondered why music at mass was so average. If these musical giants were writing for the Catholic Church, why weren't we singing their works at Mass? Well it's funny how things come full circle. I now have the chance to share these amazing works of art with our congregation, and encourage all of you to find your singing voice in the pews. I told my 3 daughters at dinner the other night that I feel so lucky and blessed to be able to bring together my two favorite things: my love of choral music and my faith. How many people get to say they are really excited about their job? I feel that way and I hope you are excited as I am. Please know that though my education may appear formal, my style is not. I am very down to earth and have lots of creative ways to teach the congregation how to sing.

If you've ever fancied yourself a singer, or fancied yourself wanting to learn how to be a better singer, please don't be shy. Let's work together. Your voices and musical talents are gifts and talents given to you by God to make this world a more holy and lovely place. (And we could sure use more holy and lovely in our lives!) I am available for private voice coaching, church choir workshops and individual and group cantor training. I have established the Youth Schola (open to children in K-9th grade) based at Sacred Heart and am leading the SH Adult Choir several weeks a month. Our four congregations will enjoy greater connection through joint worship celebrations enhanced by a Combined Choir. Children from all four churches are learning to be a "school of singers" and will enhance liturgy once a month at Sacred Heart. More things are planned including increased congregational singing, a Musician's corner in the bulletin (with greater breadth of topics on our website) in which I discuss topics such as "why we sing what we sing at Mass", and the potential for Chant Camp next summer (an intensive course for those interested in learning to sing Gregorian Chant). If you can count to 7, and can sing "do re me" from Sound of Music, you can sing chant!

St Augustine said, "He who sings, prays twice." Well then. Let's get singing!

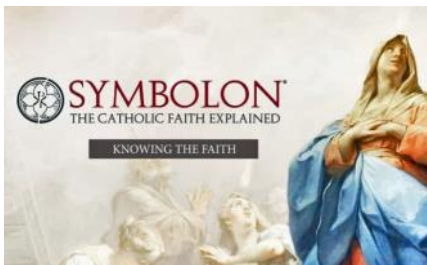
RESPECT LIFE MINISTRY

SYMBOLON Week 5: Who is Jesus?

The key words we will focus on from the videos this week are FULLY HUMAN and FULLY DIVINE. Did you know that Jesus IS God and He is also a man?

God spoke to his people through the prophets during the Old Testament times, but in these last days he has spoken to us by his Son. Jesus Christ, the Son of God, is one divine person who possesses two natures. He is truly God and truly man, not part God and part man. This profound and awesome teaching is called the hypostatic union. As both God and man, Jesus is the one and only mediator between God and man. Jesus became human to help us know God's love, to reconcile us with God and save us, to model a holy life, and to make it possible for God to live within us.

Family Formation, Grade PK to 5

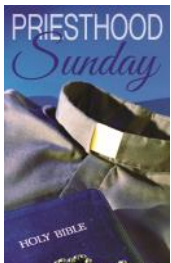
