**THE 4TH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

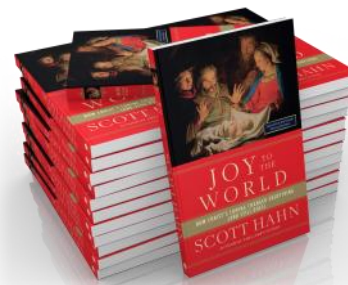

Circle of Grace: Safe Environment Training

Series Part II

Why is it important to help our young people understand the Circle of Grace?

God intends our relationships in life to be experiences of divine love. Respectful, nurturing, loving relationships increase our understanding of our own value and help us to love others. It is never too early to help young people understand how very special they are and how relationships in life are called to be sacred. Understanding this can help them to protect the special person they are and to be respectful of others. Adults, as they strive to provide a safe and protective environment, hold the responsibility to help young people understand and respect their own dignity and that of others. A truly safe and protective environment is one where young people recognize when they are safe or unsafe and know how to bring their concerns, fears, and uncertainties to the trusted adults in their lives.

What does our parish do to vet staff and volunteers who minister directly to children, youth, and vulnerable adults?

Our parish complies with mandatory diocesan policy in vetting all staff and volunteers who minister directly to children, youth, and vulnerable adults. This process, **Protecting God's Children**, under the auspices of **VIRTUS** (a service of the National Catholic Risk Retention Group) includes a 3-hr. seminar with Deacon Dennis, a background check, a staff or volunteer application, and a series of completed forms, which are tracked and recorded both in our parish and at the diocesan level. Staff and volunteers must then read one bulletin training each month as part of the ongoing VIRTUS requirements. **Circle of Grace, designed for our Catholic Church by the Archdiocese of Omaha, is the safe environment resource which we have chosen specifically for our children and youth.**

All requests are reviewed carefully by experienced Social Justice Commission members. Contact is made with the needy person; sometimes other sources of community and state financial help are arranged. The Parish offers financial help when it is critical -- a mother and child are not evicted, a car is repaired so that a

father can get to his job. Action is taken because people...caring parishioners...have donated to the "assistance" fund of Holy Eucharist. Donated money is the only source of support for this charitable program. At this time in December -- the "assistance" fund is low and can certainly use your help. 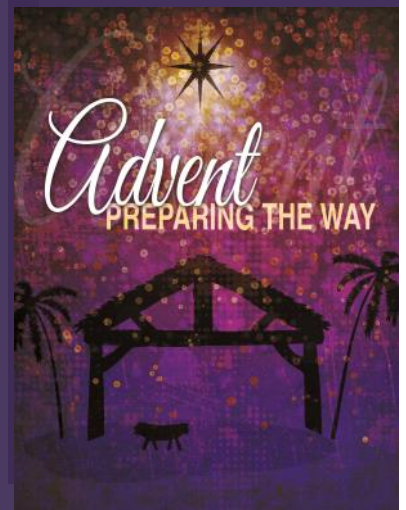
